INGREDIENTS FOR FILLING

(Yields 12 Servings)

6 Large Eggs

3 Tbs Mayonnaise

2 Tbs Dijon Mustard

1 Tbs Sriracha Sauce

½ Tbs Cajun Spice

½ Tbs Lemon Juice

1 Tbs Fine Chopped Chives

PREPARATION FOR EGG FILLING

- •Bring a deep pot of water to a boil on high heat. Reduce heat to low. When water stops boiling, place the eggs in the water using a skimmer or spoon. Increase the heat and back to boil for approximately 13-14 minutes.
- •While eggs are boiling prepare an ice bath and set aside. After 14 minutes place eggs in ice bath let cool for 2-3 minutes.
- •Once the eggs have cooled completely, peel and slice in half lengthwise. Using a spoon, remove hardened egg yolks and place in a bowl. Place remaining whites in a flat dish.
- •Using an electric mixer, beat egg yolks on low speed and crush with a fork. Then, add one by one, add remaining ingredients to incorporate mixture into a stiff play-dough like consistency.
- •Place mixture in a pastry bag (or spoon in) and pipe back into the egg white whole.
- •Top with Lobster salad mix and garnish with quinoa (recipe follows).
